LaRowe went on to say that St. James Mercy patients will have greater access to specialty services otherwise requiring significant travel, as well as enhanced convenience with the eventual introduction of an electronic medical record. "This partnership will also strengthen our ability to carry out our mission of serving the poor, the underserved, and disadvantaged," she said.

GHS will assist St. James Mercy in recruiting physicians to its service area; these physicians will be employed by St. James Mercy. In addition, Guthrie Healthcare will provide assistance in the development of an electronic medical record, and in the areas of personnel management, finance, quality review and strategic planning.

"This is a great step for two great health systems," said Mark Stensager, president and CEO, Guthrie Healthcare System. "The partnership between St. James and Guthrie strengthens us both. St. James will benefit from Guthrie's medical resources and administrative support, and as Guthrie recruits physicians for western Steuben County, the successful growth of those practices, in turn, increases all patients' access to care for the twin tiers region."
